Writing & Reading: We shall be looking at two class texts this term. First, we shall look at '*Until I Met Dudley*' where we'll use our imagination to describe how household appliances work, as well as using our explanation skills to help write instructions. We shall then move onto the text '*The Day the Crayons Quit*' where we'll spend time focusing on the main characters, interpreting emotion throughout the text and using role play to bring characters and actions to life. For class reading we have '*The Iron Man*' and will be looking for our favourite football books to help encourage reading for pleasure.

Maths: Our topic is Place Value, Addition and Subtraction working with numbers up to 1,000 and thinking about how we partition amounts accurately. We will compare and order numbers, round numbers and explore powers of 10. We'll use hands-on manipulatives such as base ten, place value charts & counters and part/whole models to support our understanding.

Project Based Learning: We're exploring Europe and learning what the different countries have to offer tourists. We'll learn the differences between a country, city, town and village. We'll think about how we can travel to different European countries and different modes of transport. We'll also investigate what the weather is like in different European countries.

RE: We shall spend time exploring different religions linking this to our PSHE and identity.

- What is religion?
- What different religions are there?
- How does religion help define your identity?
- Is religion helpful?

Forest School: Weekly sessions help us develop teamwork, resilience, and problem-solving skills through outdoor learning. We'll be exploring nature, taking on challenges, and working together on practical activities outside.

PSHE: Our topic is identity and who we are. We shall spend time discussing what makes our identity, who plays a part and the differences in everyone's identity. We shall also look at our goals and achievements and celebrate ourselves.

Food Preparation: We'll learn to stay safe in the kitchen by handling tools carefully and following instructions. We're also preparing simple meals and snacks, exploring new foods! Eating as a class helps us build social skills and enjoy a sense of community.

SCIENCE: We're exploring the Solar System and discovering

- The order of the planets
- What our planets are made of
- How the Moon orbits Earth
- How time zones work

PE: We're enjoying team games that build fitness, coordination, and co-operation. We're learning to follow rules, encourage teammates, and think about strategies to be successful.
